Welcome

- We have scheduled one meeting a month- the time says 8 a.m.-10 a.m. because that is the length of time we have the space, but we anticipate the meetings taking approximately 45 minutes. We may have longer ones depending on the topic. The meetings through December are on the Website calendar.
- For each parent meeting we will try to post the agenda on the website prior to the meeting and the PowerPoint on the website following the meeting.
- We will have index cards available at the meetings that parents can use to ask questions (in addition to asking verbally). These cards will help to plan future meetings and we will start to create an FAQ that we can post on the website. Some questions may be unique to certain parents so we ask parents to include an email or phone number in case we need to follow up with that parent.

• Drop off:

- Students can be dropped off in two ways. They can be walked to the front/glass doors of the school or in the the drive through in the parking lot. The drive through entrance gate is on the north end (closest to the office), and the exit gate is on the south end (closest to the grass field). On the first day of school parents may walk their child to their classroom.
- For pick up, students will be dismissed to one of three locations:
 - Students that will be picked up at the drive through will line up along the gym.
 - Students that are waiting for their parent to walk in will wait in the lunch area.
 - Student that are going to the Boys and Girls Club will wait at a predetermined area- we will finalize this area once we know how many students will be picked up.
 - Please discuss with your child where to wait for you.

 - We use School Nutrition Plus (SNP) as our lunch vendor.
 - Breakfast is available for purchase and is served from 7:30-8:00
